## The draft Integrated Risk Management Plan 2015-20 and modified IRMP Response Standards

The Integrated Risk Management Plan (IRMP) 2015-20 sets out how the Service will use its resources to deliver an effective fire and rescue Service. It analyses the current performance of the Service and uses this analysis to highlight any gaps within our current strategies of prevention protection and response and how we plan to meet those gaps.

A fundamental part of the Response strategy is the IRMP Response Standards which, following feedback from members of the public during Phase 2, and also as a consequence of the change in risk across the county, we have now updated. The changes are outlined in the IRMP 2015-20 document.

The online questionnaire is seeking your feedback on the draft IRMP document and the modified IRMP Response Standards. In particular, we would like to know:

- 1. Did you find this Plan easy to understand and, if not, how it could be improved?
- 2. Does the Plan provide you with sufficient information about the risks your Fire Authority deals with and, if not, what additional information would you liked to see in the Plan?
- 3. Do you feel that this Plan contains sufficient information for you to judge the effectiveness of your Fire Authority and Shropshire Fire and Rescue Service and, if not, what additional information would you like?
- 4. Do you now understand the future challenges facing your Fire Authority and, if not, what additional information would you like?
- 5. And finally, whether you agree with the changes to the terminology used in the IRMP Response Standards and again, if you don't agree, why is that?

Your feedback will be used to assist the Fire Authority in developing the contents of the final version of the IRMP 2015-20 document, which will be published in January 2015.
